My child has been in close contact with someone who tested positive. Can my child attend school?

Yes, your child may attend school.

Someone in my household tests positive for corona. Can my child attend school?

Please make sure your child avoids contact with the infected (or infectious) person. Your child doesn't have to stay at home.

My child develops corona-related symptoms during the day. Does my child have to go home?

For Nursery/Primary

Your child will be seen by the School Nurse who will assess whether your child should go home. For children in Primary, no self-test is carried out at school.

For Secondary:

Your child will be seen by the School Nurse who will assess whether your child should go home. If necessary, a self-test will be done with your child. If your child is under 16, she will call you for permission. Older students will have to grant their consent themselves before performing the test.

Are self-tests still available at school?

Self-tests are still available at school. These can be found for secondary students at the exit of the school and for primary via the class teacher.
